Don't be jealous or proud but be humble and consider others more important than yourselves. Care about them as much as you care about yourselves and think the same way that Christ Jesus thought. (Philippians 2:3-5; CEV)

I've been thinking about this part of Paul's Letter to the Philippians quite a bit recently. We can't copy Jesus exactly as he was both fully human and fully divine whereas we are, of course, 'only human.' This is not an excuse. however, for us to not try and be Christ-like in our attitudes and in our dealings with one another. As my mum used to say to me, "Treat others as you would like to be treated." Whether she knew it or not, my mum was guoting Jesus in Matthew 7:12. I'm not sure who first said it, but I do like the phrase: It's nice to be important, but it's much more important to be nice. Another saying that I like in a similar vein is: People don't care how much you know until they know how much you care. Many of us will have seen at least something of the Olympic Games from Paris this summer. I have been struck by how gracious most of the athletes have been in congratulating others that have been more successful than them or praising the team as being more important than themselves alone. There was one notable exception which took place in the context of gymnastics. During a team competition, one of the gymnasts fell from some apparatus and effectively lost that team any chance of victory. The other teammates of that competitor turned their backs on him, essentially shunning him. I can only imagine how devastating that must have been because the individual would already have been feeling upset and disappointed.

Writing to the church in Philippi, Paul urges his hearers and readers of the letter to put away such negative emotions as pride and jealousy. Rather, he says, let the Philippians, and us, strive to imitate the mind of Christ who always put the needs of others first. Let us emulate his humility and really care for one another, as others do for us.
